#### OF THE CENSUS!

Even in this pandemic, there are a few civic duties to be tended to. Have you checked your voter registration status? For sure? Best to check now! Everything takes longer these days. Per order of the governor, all registered voters will be mailed a ballot for the November 2020 election, whether or not they have signed up for an absentee ballot. Because of this new order from the governor, we will all be able to vote by mail in the November 2020 election, but you must be a registered voter to receive that ballot. You can check on the status of your registration <a href="here">here</a>. You will need your driver's license or ID card handy if you check this way. You can also call (415) 473–6456 here in Marin and ask them to double-check on your registration.

Did you fill out your census form? It's not too late if you haven't. If you do not respond by early August a census taker may appear at your door to interview you. Being counted is really important. The census determines the number of representatives we have in Congress and also affects the distribution of billions of dollars from the federal government. You can respond online, by phone or by mail.
