OPERA

Opera for Breakfast? The Metropolitan Opera is offering a new series, "Met Star Recitals" approximately every two weeks on Saturdays, live at 10:00am Pacific time, but on demand for 12 days following the live performance. Renee Fleming is up next, on August 1st. Each performance in the series costs \$20 and tickets can be purchased on the Met website. The series will run approximately twice a month on Saturdays through December 19. The concerts are a mix of live performance and videos from previously fully staged opera performances.

SF Opera Odes to Joy. A collection of individual past and current resident artists at home and <u>singing uplifting songs from the operatic repertory</u>.

SF Opera Productions. As part of their Opera is On programming, SF Opera offers free on-demand streaming of past productions to subscribers and donors, and periodically streams past productions for free on Saturdays and Sundays for anyone able to tune in to those specific offerings.
