## PLEASE VOTE ON TUESDAY, NOV. 3

The Novato Village Steering Committee encourages our members and volunteers to vote in the upcoming federal and Sstate election. Please read the information below about registering to vote, Vote-by-Mail (VBM), how to track your ballot once it is mailed, and the location of polling places in Novato. AND if you need assistance with getting your VBM ballot to a ballot box or polling place, *our volunteers can help you*.

## **ELECTION DAY IS TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2020**

All of California's **registered voters** will be mailed a ballot no later than October 5. Early voting and in-person voting locations will be available to voters. In California, the deadline to register to vote for this election is **October 19, 2020**. Your registration must be postmarked or submitted electronically no later than October 19, 2020.

If you believe you are already registered, you can verify your registration online with our "My Voter Status" tool. If you are not

already registered, you can register online at RegisterToVote.ca.gov.

#### Vote by mail for 2020 only

All registered voters will be sent a vote-by-mail ballot for the November 3, 2020 general election. The procedure:

- Fill out your ballot.
- After you have voted, insert your ballot in the envelope provided, making sure you complete all required information on the envelope.
- You may return your voted ballot by mail, in person, or to a drop box.
- If you are returning your ballot by mail, it must be postmarked on or before Election Day and received by your county elections office no later than 17 days after Election Day.
- If you are returning your ballot in person or dropping it in a drop box, it must be delivered no later than the close of polls at 8:00pm on November 3rd.
- Anyone may return your ballot for you, as long as they do not get paid on a per-ballot basis. In order for your ballot to be counted, you must fill out the authorization section found on the outside of your ballot envelope.

When your vote-by-mail ballot is received by your <u>county elections</u> <u>official</u>, your signature on the return envelope will be compared to the signature on your voter registration card to ensure they match. To preserve the secrecy of your ballot, the ballot will then be separated from the envelope and tallied.

The California Secretary of State is now offering "Where's My Ballot?"—a new way for voters to track and receive notifications on the status of their vote-by-mail ballot. Powered by BallotTrax, "Where's My Ballot?" lets voters know where their ballot is, and its status, every step of the way.

A voter who has signed up will receive notices via email, text, or voice message from the county elections official regarding the status of the voter's vote-by-mail ballot including:

- When the ballot has been delivered
- The date that the voter's ballot is expected to be delivered to the voter
- If the voter's ballot is returned as undeliverable to the county

- When the voter's completed ballot has been received by the county
- Whether the voter's completed ballot has been accepted or a reason why the ballot could not be accepted and instructions of steps the voter can take in order to have the ballot accepted
- The deadline for the voter to return his or her ballot if the county has not received a voter's completed ballot by specified dates as determined by the county elections official
- <u>Sign-up here</u> to receive automatic email, SMS (text), or voice call notifications about your ballot.

Your Voter Booklet from Marin County Registrar of Voters will tell you the location you should use if you choose to vote in-person. Look for the address on the back cover of the *County Voter Information Guide*. See information about <u>early in-person voting</u> and <u>ballot drop boxes</u>.

Novato Village volunteers may assist member voters by picking up the completed vote-by-mail ballot. The ballot should be placed in the accompanying envelope and sealed, signed by BOTH the voter AND the volunteer in the designated sections on the back of the envelope.

**Important!** Sign your return envelope! If you do not, your ballot will not be counted.

Our coffee guest speaker will be **Kevin Colgate, ESCOM program** (Emeritus Students of the College of Marin). Kevin's background: MBA & teaching fellow George Washington University, 20 years (in parallel) adjunct faculty evening programs. He also has 40 years in leadership positions in new/emerging commercial software development companies.

**ESCOM** is the lifelong learning organization at College of Marin. Emeritus College was created in 1974 at the College of Marin for older adults. As a pioneer in the innovative use of the community colleges for adults, ESCOM was selected nationally as a model by the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare and helped many institutions initiate similar programs. Dedicated to the principle of lifelong learning, its initial program of seven courses for about 80 women and men now offers up to 50 classes with over 1,000 enrollments each quarter. There are no previous educational requirements for participation in ESCOM if you are 55 and over—only the desire to learn.

One popular feature is the clubs. Clubs are specially designed by and for the members including topics such as: adventuring, book, bridge, chess, current events, ethics, philosophy, film, opera, Scrabble, and writing. Currently there are more than 20 clubs. Join the coffee to find out more!


