OFFLINE ACTIVITIES

In the Kitchen Easy Leftover Turkey Enchilada Pie Ingredients

- 3 Tbsp olive oil
- ¹/₄ cup chopped onion
- 1/2 tsp cumin, if you have it
- 2 cups shredded leftover turkey (or adjust to suit—this amount is for a pie plate-sized batch)
- 8 corn or flour tortillas (or adjust if making more or less than one pie plate-sized recipe), cut into quarters
- 1 10-oz can red enchilada sauce

 1 ½ - 2 cups shredded cheese—cheddar or mix of cheddar and Monterey jack, even some pieces of Velveeta, if you like

Instructions

Soften onions in olive oil and mix in the cumin, if desired Add turkey and heat through Butter or use a bit of olive oil to coat a pie plate Coat pieces of tortilla with enchilada sauce and spread a layer on the bottom of the pie plate to fully cover Add a layer of turkey and a layer of cheese Repeat the process, adding enchilada-coated tortilla pieces, then a layer of turkey and onion mixture and cheese. End with a layer of coated tortilla pieces Pour over any remaining enchilada sauce [Note—you can also add leftover veggies or sweet potatoes to the layers, if desired.]

Bake at 350 for 25 - 30 minutes, until bubbly

Easy Four-Ingredient Mac and Cheese—great if you are tired of turkey! Ingredients

lb. dried elbow macaroni pasta
cup heavy cream
oz (2 cups +/-) shredded cheddar cheese
cup shredded parmesan cheese
Salt and pepper, optional, to taste

Instructions

Bring four cups salted water (2 teaspoons +/- of salt) to a boil Add macaroni and cook according to package instructions—9 to 12 minutes usually

Heat cream in heavy saucepan over medium heat until it starts to bubble—watch and stir

Add cheese, stir and heat until bubbly—about 5-7 minutes, stir often Pour cheese sauce over drained cooked macaroni
