

## **COVID-19 UPDATE**



Marin Public Health announced last week that the State of California has activated the Federal Retail Pharmacy Program, providing additional vaccine opportunities at 128 CVS stores and 374 Rite Aid stores across the state. Both pharmacies will be using the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine. Bottom line: lots more opportunities to get vaccinated. Keep in mind, you need an appointment, so don't just wander into one of these pharmacies seeking a vaccination! In Marin, Rite Aid is scheduling vaccinations for healthcare workers and residents age 65 & older and making the shots available at these Rite Aid locations, subject to availability of vaccines:

- Rite Aid: Corte Madera 431 Corte Madera Town Center
- Rite Aid: Mill Valley 701 East Blithedale Ave.
- Rite Aid: San Rafael 1500 Northgate Mall
- Rite Aid: San Rafael 471 3rd Street

CVS in San Anselmo - 880 Sir Francis Drake Blvd. This location is also

Wearing masks, social distancing, avoiding indoor gatherings and washing your hands remain important whether or not you are vaccinated!

## TO MASK, OR DOUBLE-MASK?

The CDC, based on new research, is suggesting double-masking—a disposable surgical mask covered by a cloth mask—can be really helpful in improving the fit and filtration of masking, thus improving protection related to spreading or contracting COVID-19.

Key points from the CDC guidance include:

- choose a mask with a nose wire you can bend around the top of your nose (many disposable masks have this feature)
- make sure your mask fits snuggly against your face (some masks are pretty loose around the cheeks)
- chose a mask with layers of material or put a cloth mask over a disposable surgical mask so that the second mask pushes the edges of the inner mask against your face. Don't layer N-95 disposable masks—just make sure they are really snug against your face

Marin's Center for Independent Living (CIL) has recently partnered with Dignity at Home to offer free home-safety services inspections and certain no-cost, in-home modification services including grab bars, raised toilet seats, and handheld showers. The program is open to
