Our first profile is Claudia Gardner, one of our volunteers and RVV Steering Committee members.



Claudia lives in a beautiful San Anselmo home with gorgeous views of Sleepy Hollow. She has a roommate who also happens to be named Claudia.

Claudia's two daughters Kristen and Karen have families of their own. Kristen lives nearby with her 11-year-old daughter, Zora, and works for Marin County in human services. Karen is a retired school teacher in Colorado Springs who also enjoys volunteering to give back to her community. Karen's son, Tim, served 7 years in the Navy and now makes government drones in Maryland. Karen's daughter, Kathleen, works in HR for the Colorado Department of Corrections. Claudia adores her family and is very proud of her two daughters and three grandchildren.

Claudia dreamed of becoming a veterinarian and took all of her undergraduate courses at UC Davis. When she went to apply to vet school, she was told that profession was for MEN ONLY! To make the most of her coursework she applied to UCSF and became a dental hygienist. She loved her patients and even made house calls to seniors who could no longer come into the office.

After Claudia's first bout with breast cancer she started volunteering in the early 2000s with TCL (To Celebrate Life) a foundation which raises funds for local outreach programs that provide direct services to men and women going through breast cancer. After 52 years as a hygienist Claudia retired in 2016 to care for her beloved husband, Dan, until he passed in 2018. Soon after, she learned of Marin Villages and quickly signed up to volunteer. She missed working with seniors, which she had done as a volunteer through her local hygienist association where she spent time with seniors in a day care center and nursing homes.

Claudia and Dan built a vacation home on the south shore of Lake Tahoe in 2001. She goes there often for a change of scenery and to visit with her neighbors and friends in the area (minimally now with social distancing). The cross-country skiing is still great!

Claudia says she has always enjoyed being with older people because they have such wisdom and interesting stories to tell. She feels so fortunate to be involved with Marin Villages because of all the wonderful people she has met and had the pleasure to work with. She enjoys making supportive phone calls, driving, and shopping for our members.

Claudia said that when the shelter order is lifted, she is most looking forward to spending time with her family and friends and having the ability to travel again.
