NOVATO VILLAGE ANNOUNCEMENTS

Meet **Marge Jackson**, a member of the Novato Village Steering Committee and the membership coordinator. Marge is also the lead member of the Program Committee.

Marge was born in Melrose, Minnesota, and raised mostly in Minneapolis. She lived with her grandparents on a farm near Melrose from second through fifth grade, and then moved to Minneapolis from sixth grade through high school and two years of college. After two years of college, Marge got married. Because of her husband's job transfer, she, with her husband and firstborn daughter, moved to Berkeley, California in February 1957. She experienced a dramatic climate change! She left the snow and cold sleet when she came to "sunny California" with palm trees, flowers, and green grass...beautiful!

As a child, one of Marge's special memories was "taking lunch to my grandfather in the fields. He was plowing behind horses, his face covered with black dust...I still can see his face. I enjoyed time with him while he ate his lunch; he was a very soft-spoken and gentle man."

Marge left California to move to Iowa, then back to Minnesota, and finally back to California. She says, "The Bay Area called me back." In 1973, she graduated from Sonoma State University with a BA in sociology.

Marge has worked at a variety of careers, including long-distance telephone operator in Minnesota; employment counselor in San Francisco; Marin County youth employment counselor in a summer youth program; and she was part of a nutrition education program at the University of California, Berkeley. After that last experience, she took a job at the first health food store in Novato.

Marge read about the Village program in an article in a San Francisco paper. She thought it was a great program and wondered when will it come to Novato? Then in 2015 there was a meeting at Beth Livoti's home about starting Novato Village and Marge became involved. Marge says,

"Volunteering for Novato Village has provided me with the opportunity of meeting so many inspiring people! I would not have met many of these people except for the Novato Village organization. I enjoy these new friendships and the inspiration they bring me."

Controlled Burns Scheduled for Novato

Seasonal firefighter trainings and fuel reduction effort to run May 26 – June 25

Several controlled burns scheduled for late May and June will be visible throughout Novato, so the Marin County Fire Department—which is overseeing the events—is eager to get the word out now. The controlled burns are part of the annual training regimen for seasonal firefighters and a way to reduce wildfire fuels. This is the training that in past years has taken place on the St. Vincent property adjacent to Highway 101 in the Marinwood area. This time it will take place along the northern slope of Big Rock Ridge, behind the neighborhoods of Vineyard Road, Wildhorse Valley, Marin Highlands, Indian Valley, and the County Club area of Ignacio.

"This year's training site sits just below Big Rock Ridge and is very visible from Novato," said Marin County Battalion Chief Graham Groneman. "We know the smoke up on the hillsides will be seen from all over. Our outreach will be extensive because we would like to reduce nonemergency calls to our 9-1-1 dispatchers once we get started. The dispatchers need to be ready to handle real emergencies."

The prescribed burns on **May 26, 27, and 28** and **June 23, 24, and 25** will be in the westernmost areas of the ranch, just south of the residences off Vineyard Road. Training organizers understand resident concerns about conducting controlled burns during a spring season that has produced very little rain. The moisture in heavier vegetation is still relatively high at this time of year, so it's easier to burn materials that are targeted to burn during training, Groneman said. The burn site is surrounded by a combination of fire control lines and dirt roads that are in place to keep the fire from spreading beyond the training area. Additional firefighters are also on hand to support the holding operations.
