

Marin F.A.S.T. enlightens and educates us on how to protect ourselves against common financial scams. A 2017 study asserts that financial elder abuse costs \$36.5 billion annually. In Marin County alone, financial abuse cases make up 32% of all referrals to Adult Protective Services.
