Touch wood, disasters have been happening around us, but not here so far. But let's not get complacent and think it won't happen here. Get ready! Be prepared! An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure! Choose your favorite adage, but don't put off the things listed below!

Remember to sign up for fire and other disaster alerts if you have a cell phone or voice over internet phone. Register with AlertMarin (<u>www.alertmarin.org</u>) and with Nixle (text your zip code to 888777). Note that landlines are already registered with AlertMarin.

Create an emergency plan with your family or closest family friends so everyone knows where to meet up or where you will be if separated and what escape routes you have identified.

Keep your emergency kits and "go bags" where you can easily find them. Include a mask and bandana to help protect against smoke. Don't forget sturdy shoes and long pants and a jacket. Prepare pet carriers and pet food, if you have pets.

Always keep your cell phone fully charged and your gas tank at least ½ full in case electricity is lost.

Evacuate via car, rather than on foot. Only call 911 if you have no means of transportation and need to evacuate.
