COVID UPDATE
COVID and flus and colds, oh my!



It's the celebratin' season, but it's also the season for avoiding colds and flus—and, sadly, COVID, too. Despite our high vaccination numbers, new cases of COVID are on the rise in Marin and we now have the highest rate of infection in the Bay Area. The good news? Because of our high vaccination rates, hospitalization and death rates have not gone up. While the vaccine cannot completely prevent infection, it does severely reduce the chance of hospitalization or serious illness. So getting your vaccine—and now your booster, too—remains a very smart move.

Last week, Public Health Officer Dr. Matt Willis briefed the Board of Supervisors on our county's pediatric and booster vaccination progress while also diving into the emergence of the Omicron variant. The season's first cases of flu have been recorded in Marin, and they usually peak in January and February. If you haven't already, please get your flu shot soon! You can even combine it with your COVID vaccine or booster at many sites. To find sites for either COVID boosters or flu shots or both, please go to https://myturn.ca.gov/ to start the process. You will be asked which vaccine you need, and then taken to a page where you start answering questions that will help them get you to a site where you can schedule an appointment. **Tip**: if you need a COVID booster, it's helpful to have your COVID vaccination card handy unless you remember the dates of your previous COVID vaccines.

As for the common cold, it's usually more of an annoyance than anything, but there is no vaccine. And there have been some very nasty strains going around this fall so far, based on word of mouth. Your best defense is washing your hands well and often, and wearing a mask when out and about. Why ruin the holidays with a pesky head cold you don't want to spread to anyone else?

New masking mandate

Seems like we blink and the rules change again—a good illustration of how unpredictable the COVID virus can be. The State of California decided this week to **reinstitute the mask mandate for all public indoor spaces**, including retail and restaurants, from December 15, 2021 to January 15, 2022. This will override Marin's "strong recommendation" to wear masks and make them mandatory again for that time period, whether you are vaccinated or not.

The Book of Lost Friends, Lisa Wingate

In 1875 three young women—Black, white, and Creole—head west together from Louisiana, each for her own painful but powerful reason. In the same town in 1987 a first-year teacher arrives full of idealistic energy, only to meet a wall of suspicion of new people and ideas. The two stories weave together as the book progresses, supplemented by startling stories from actual "Lost Friends" advertisements that appeared in Southern newspapers after the Civil War, as newly freed slaves searched for loved ones who had been sold away. Fascinating, painful, sometimes quietly beautiful and other times exciting, The Book of Lost Friends is a wonderful read and a lesson in a chapter of the South's history. The Beatles, Get Back, Disney Plus

If you are not a fan of the Beatles, this will likely not be interesting. But if you are, it's a moving look at their last big collaboration that led to the writing of 14 songs in less than a month, five of which were performed on the rooftop of Apple Records in 1969, the famous last time they ever played together live. An earlier film made from the same 60 hours of footage showed the sessions to be miserable and led to the impression the band all hated each other at this point. This footage is more thoughtfully culled, showing that despite the struggles, they still all enjoyed one another's company and still had that fun genius for making music together. 
