COVID UPDATE

We're starting to hear the term *endemic* used as the next step in how we refer to Covid. But what does that mean? Dr. Matt Willis, Marin County's public health officer, explains the difference between *endemic*, *epidemic*, and *pandemic* in this four-minute video, and tells us what endemic does and does not mean (hint: it does not mean that Covid's severity or danger will decrease, just as the flu's does not, from year to year—and we are still in a pandemic for now). Even though the caseload is still higher than any prior wave/variant, the good news is that the number of active cases in Marin is decreasing, and hospitalizations remain relatively low because as a community we are well-vaccinated and following safety precautions.
