### Getting to know you

**B.J. Slater: Love and Light** by Kathleen Jackson



Hearing B. J. discuss her life, I was reminded of a kaleidoscope: a succession of changing phases or actions seen through color and light. B.J. lived her early days in Berkeley, CA. The church was the center of her family home. After attending high school in Orinda, she went to college and majored in art. She then embarked on a journey that four years ago brought her to Marin Villages.

B.J. describes herself as spiritual, right-brained, creative, active, and entrepreneurial. In her early twenties in Southern California, she was blessed by a daughter, and, needing to provide for her, she started a successful swimming school. Having moved to Northern California, in her thirties B.J. graduated from Dominican College with a BA in psychology while running a home and parenting three children. She became a youth minister and area director with Marin County Young Life. In her twenties she designed clothing, in her thirties she was with Young Life and co-owner of a music publishing business. In her forties and fifties she was an interior designer and manager for Calico Corners and Ethan Allen.

B.J. was happily single for eighteen years until she fell deeply in love with her neighbor; she was 'the girl next door.' She has been married to John, a volunteer and former surgical assistant, for nine years. Early in their marriage the couple moved to Chicago for two years to help raise John's son. Upon returning to Marin, B.J. worked in addiction recovery for two years and then, online, she found the perfect job for her gifts and values: Membership Coordinator and Operations Manager of Marin Villages. She loves her work at Marin Villages. She also loves

spending time at the West Point Inn while her husband is working his retirement job as an innkeeper.

What B.J. values most are her relationship with God, her family and friends, her care and concern for the world, and staying in the moment. Her passion is 'being love and light,' through which, like a kaleidoscope, she delights the myriad of people whose lives she touches.
