<u>Getting to know you</u>

Ron Burlick: The Get Away Driver by Kathleen Jackson



If you have ever been a passenger with Ron Burlick, you have no doubt heard him refer to himself as a 'getaway driver,' meaning he comes from New Jersey where "traffic signals and speed limits are merely suggestions." That was then; this is now, as Ron's current 'getaway' driving enables older people to get to their appointments and enjoy his delightful company.

Ron was born and spent his early years in New Jersey. In his late teens he decided to drive to Los Angeles with \$100 in his pocket because he was convinced that "the world will take care of me." After three months he realized that it was he who needed to take care of himself; his L.A. sojourn lasted more than a year, and he returned to New Jersey wiser but no richer.

Following a stint in the Army, Ron started a career in data processing that resulted in traveling throughout the U.S. for work, frequently to the Bay Area. He decided that he would rather live in California than New Jersey. "New Jersey has a four-season climate, two of which are not my preference." He married, moved to Marin County ("my wife inadvertently snuck into one of my

suitcases"), took a job in data processing, and bought a house in Mill Valley where their son Ted was born. Ted's entry into Ron's life taught him "what love is."

In 2004, Ron stopped working, decided he wanted to be a volunteer, and, no longer married, bought a house in San Anselmo where he has been 'ungainfully employed' by the house's landscaping and projects. When his mother moved to Petaluma, he spent much time with her. Being her sole support for twenty years, he learned what was needed to help people as they age, from chores around the house to getting in and out of a car. "Everything I learned about helping older people I learned from helping my mom." That knowledge, coupled with his ongoing house projects, has given him the understanding of how to best be a Marin Villages volunteer, a 'job' he loves and has done for six years. He says, "It is a match made in...Sleepy Hollow."

Although his wit and playful conversations may be the first qualities one can enjoy with Ron, he is very spiritual and very serious about helping others live as independently as they can for as long as they can. He claims, "I have lived eighty years and have done a lot in those eighty years. I am definitely the product of my life experiences."

It is my hope that others experience the depth and delightful spirit of Ron Burlick driving his "getaway car."
