#### Greetings,

The road from Dillingham to the village is about 20 miles of paved and mostly graded roadway. We arrived at the Wood River Tikchik State Park's lot to unload cargo from the car to the sled behind our snowmobile. It was about 15 degrees the afternoon I arrived, and sunny and bright. The next morning the temp on the outhouse read -15 degrees. The icicles were beautifully curved by the winds that Scott, my son, experienced before I arrived.

There is an annual event in Dillingham that matches up with celebrations around the state. It is called Beaver Round-Up and celebrates when the locals brought their fur pelts to town to sell. They have events over a weeks' time. Scott drove to town on his snow-go with friends via back trails. They spent the day on a Poker Run, where participants drive to five stations to retrieve five cards. No money was won by our group. Scott took the panorama shot with his drone.
