It's June and summer flowers are coming! I particularly love sunflowers. Did you know they thrive in every state of the U.S. and at least for most gardeners are among the easiest of the "showy" flowers to cultivate and grow? Green thumb or not, and whether or not you have 40 acres to plant as pictured above, maybe try growing at least one or two sunflowers on your deck or patio this summer. Flowers bring happiness!

Not gone yet!

In Dr. Matt Willis's video mid-May he reported that only 10 people were currently hospitalized with COVID in Marin. We have moved into the <u>low</u> level of risk category for COVID infections, and death rates from COVID in our county have declined significantly. He attributes this to Marin's high level of vaccinations, which has helped residents here avoid infections and also helped reduce the severity of illness in those who do get infected. But he also pointed out that immunity from infection does wear off, and everyone over 65 is strongly encouraged to get a second bivalent booster. These boosters are widely available in Marin so please do consider making an appointment for one for yourself, and the sooner the better! Wish they had been available before my trip to NY, which was the source of my own recent infection!

What do you know about Juneteenth?

In 2021, the federal government recognized June 19th, or elided together "Juneteenth," as a federal holiday. The date of June 19, 1865 was the date 250,000 enslaved Blacks in Texas finally received news of their emancipation when the Union Army made its way into Galveston. The emancipation of slaves had been officially declared by Abraham Lincoln two years earlier but ignored by states under Confederate control. Starting in 1866 the date came to be celebrated in Galveston and became an official Texas state holiday in 1980. It has been a well-known day celebrating liberation, culture and joy in many Black communities across the country for years but was unknown to many Whites until the declaration of the Federal holiday. There are sure to be a number of programs on TV and locally here in Marin celebrating Juneteenth this year, but you can also learn more about its importance and history from the links below to articles from the *Smithsonian* and *The New York Times*.


