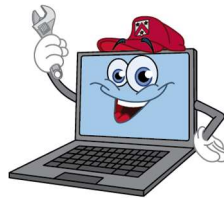

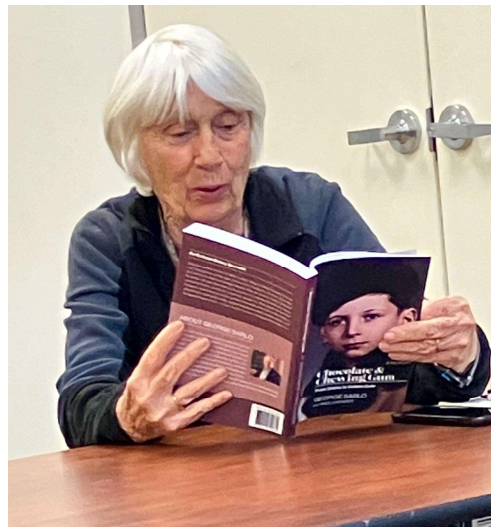
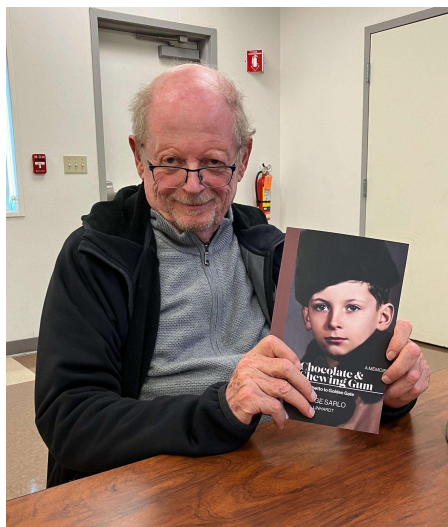

Tribute to Lisa Guthrie

I first met Lisa about fifty years ago. She was good friends with Abby Clow (my best friend in the seventh grade) and the two of them commuted and worked in the city. Lisa was a landscape architect, and she was always working on some interesting garden project. She knew more about plants than anyone I knew, and hearing her rattle off the proper Latin names of plants in a garden would make your head spin! Lisa and her husband, Walt, used to give Sunday brunches on the deck of their Mill Valley home for close friends, and I was honored to join them a few times. As the years went by, I was privileged to know her more and was continually impressed by her depth and grace.

This is what I learned about her:

- She was a very talented artist.
- She was a beloved watercolor teacher for many years at La Romita School of Art in Italy.
- She was one of the first and a dedicated member of the Marin County Watercolor Society.
- Lisa was a great cook.
- She was a dancer—who knew!
- She was an avid reader and loved interesting discussions.
- She was elegant and had grace and humility.
- Lisa had a sharp wit and a wicked sense of humor.
- She loved to laugh.

Lisa was fun to be around. One of my fondest memories is a trip to Napa we took to draw farm animals of a friend of hers. We drew sheep, Danny the Black Angus, and goats. But the funniest was Spot, the horse, who walked up to Lisa as she was drawing to see what she was doing. He put his head on her shoulder to watch her draw—or maybe he was an art critic! We laughed so hard.



The family is planning a memorial service and will let us know when it is scheduled.
